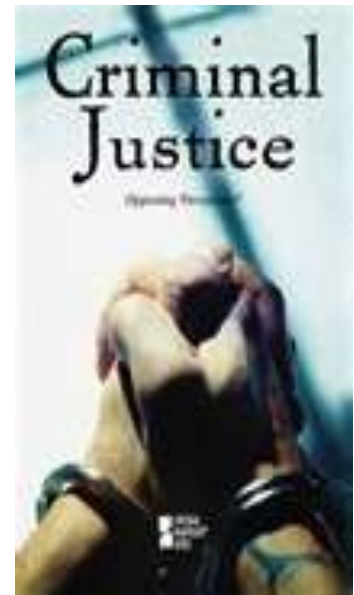

Ian or Doc is going to talk to Matt Talbot and see what he thinks as far as a good time and when they really need help.

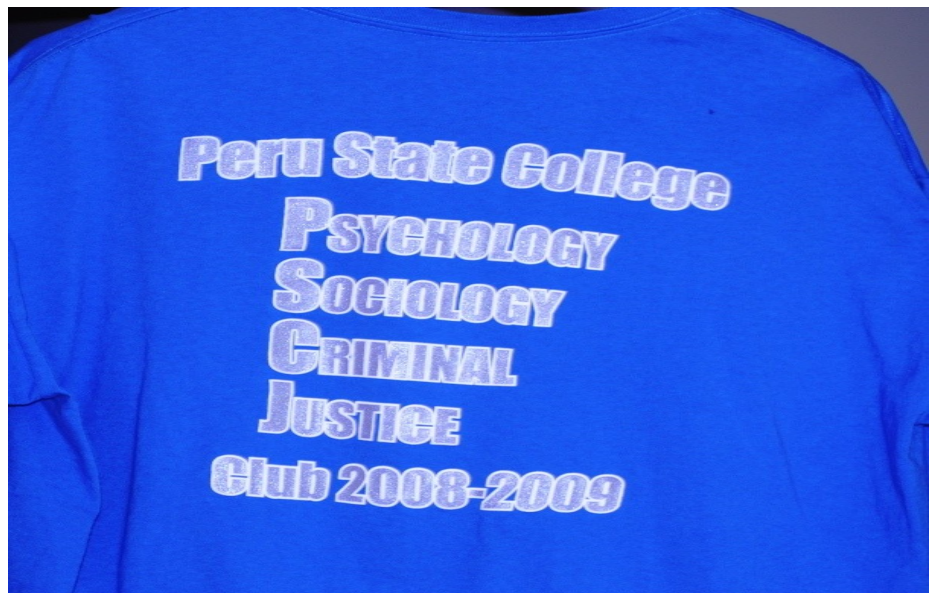
